

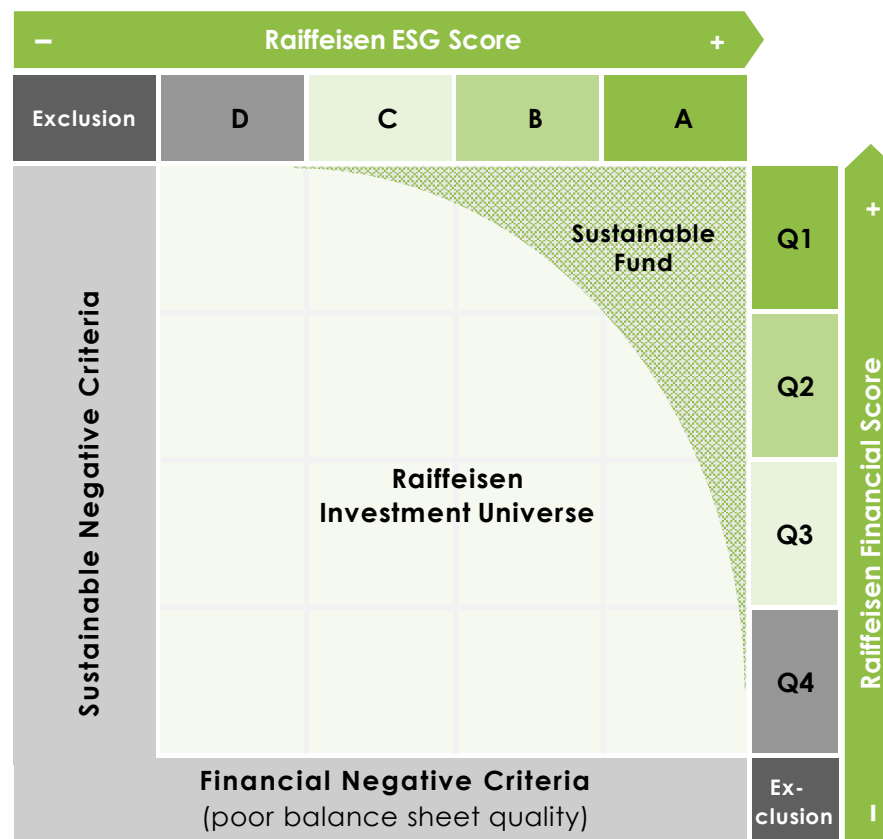

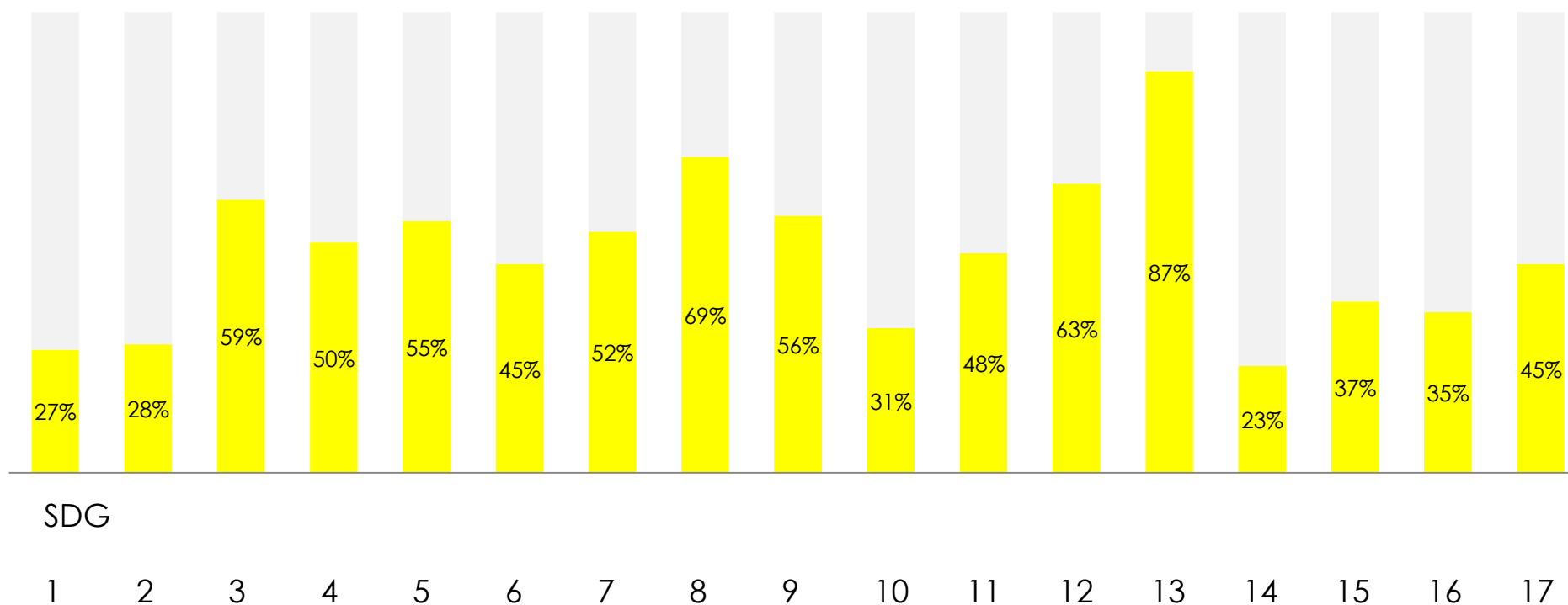

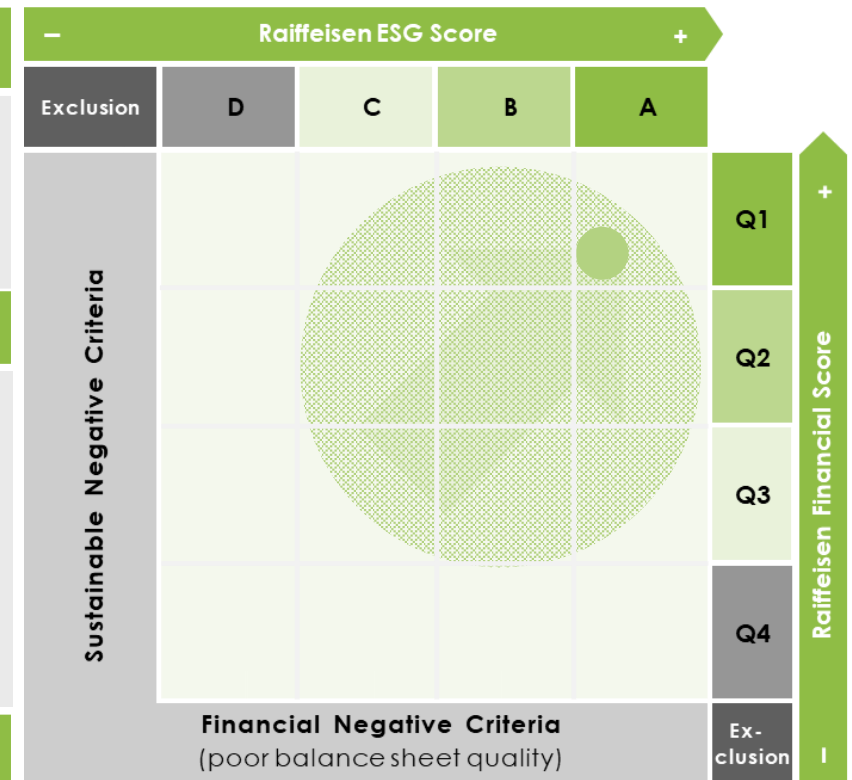
Interesting for ESG reasons, because ...

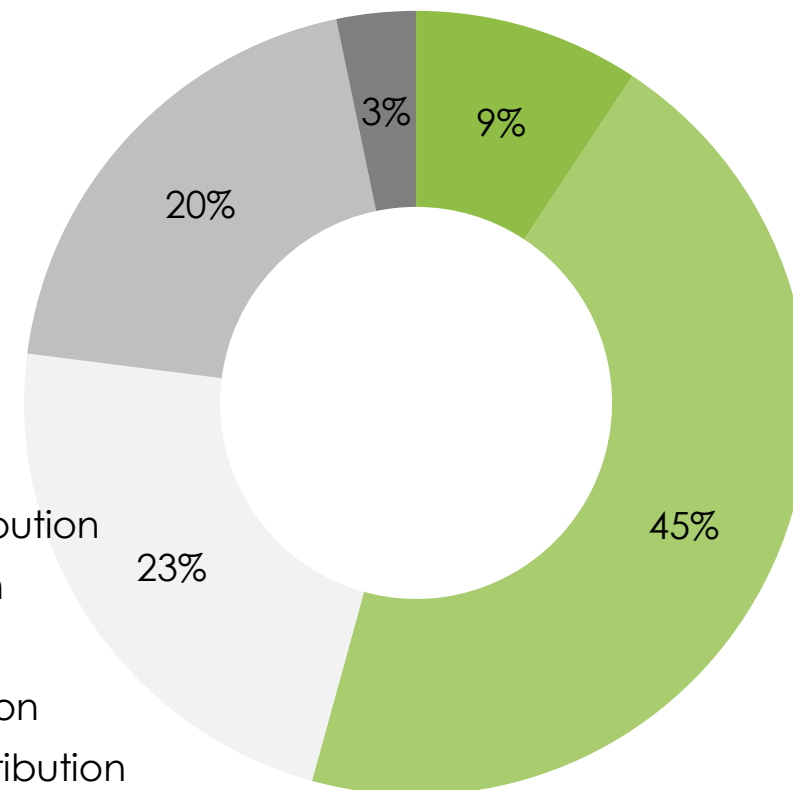
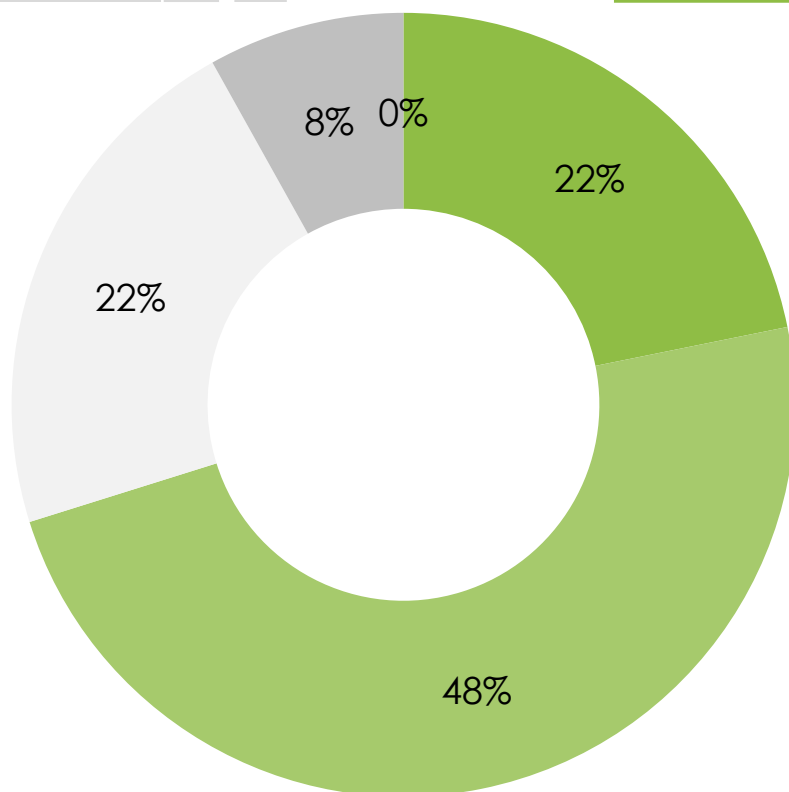
